Using the information about Mount Vesuvius, Pompeii, you have the following activities to complete:

- Read the information and highlight or underline any key information that you think is significant about the eruption.
 - Use this information to first of all plan and then write a newspaper article reporting on this major event as an eyewitness in the town of Pompeii. (Complete the planning template before you write—think back to when we wrote a newspaper article in class and use this to help you!)
 - Your second writing activity is to write a narrative where the setting of your story is Mount Vesuvius, Pompeii—the rest is up to you! Consider: your characters, the dilemma, the resolution if there is one and how you can make it exciting for the reader! Maybe you could read it aloud to someone at home—are they excited? What is their reaction?
 - Record your writing in your home learning book and be prepared to share.
