Where is Kenya?

Kenya is a country in the continent of Africa. Kenya is on the east coast so has beaches leading into the Indian Ocean.

What is the Capital City like?

What is the weather like in Kenya?

Kenya is on the equator (the middle of the Earth's surface) so has a tropical climate. This means that it is often hot. There are times when it rains a lot and times where it doesn't rain for longer periods of time.

What is school like in Kenya?

Children and young people don't need to pay for school in Kenya but many young people do not attend because they are too busy helping to do chores such as cleaning, fetching water, working the land and tending the cattle. Children who do go to school have to walk very far to get there, they sometimes even have to swim across rivers!

Who are the Maasai?

The Maasai are a tribe of people who live on the southern border of Kenya. The area is called the Maasai Mara and is an important area for wildlife conservation. There are elephants, lions, giraffes, hippos, zebras and lots more. Can you imagine coming out of your house and spotting a zebra?

The Maasai wear red clothes to represent the blood of a lion which make them look brave. They also wear lots of jewellery made from beads to show how important they are.

Who is Wangari Maathai?

Wangari Maathai is from Kenya. She was the first African woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize. What an inspiration woman she was! She won the prize because she encouraged women to plant trees near where they lived to combat deforestation. They called this the Green Belt Movement. It is believed that this movement encouraged the planting of over thirty million trees! What an incredible accomplishment!
