A compound word is made from joining two simple words to make a new word. Both the simple words make sense on their own.

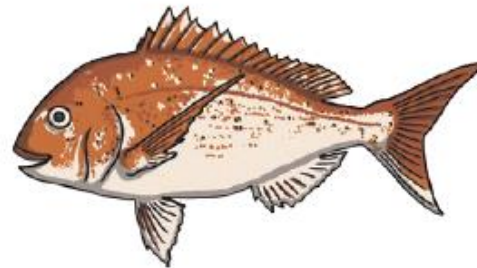
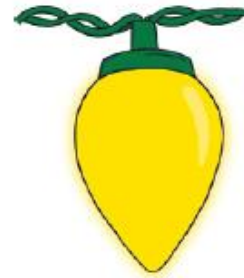
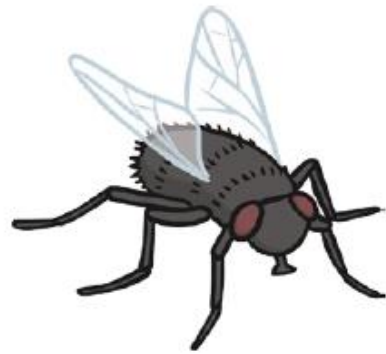
green + house = greenhouse

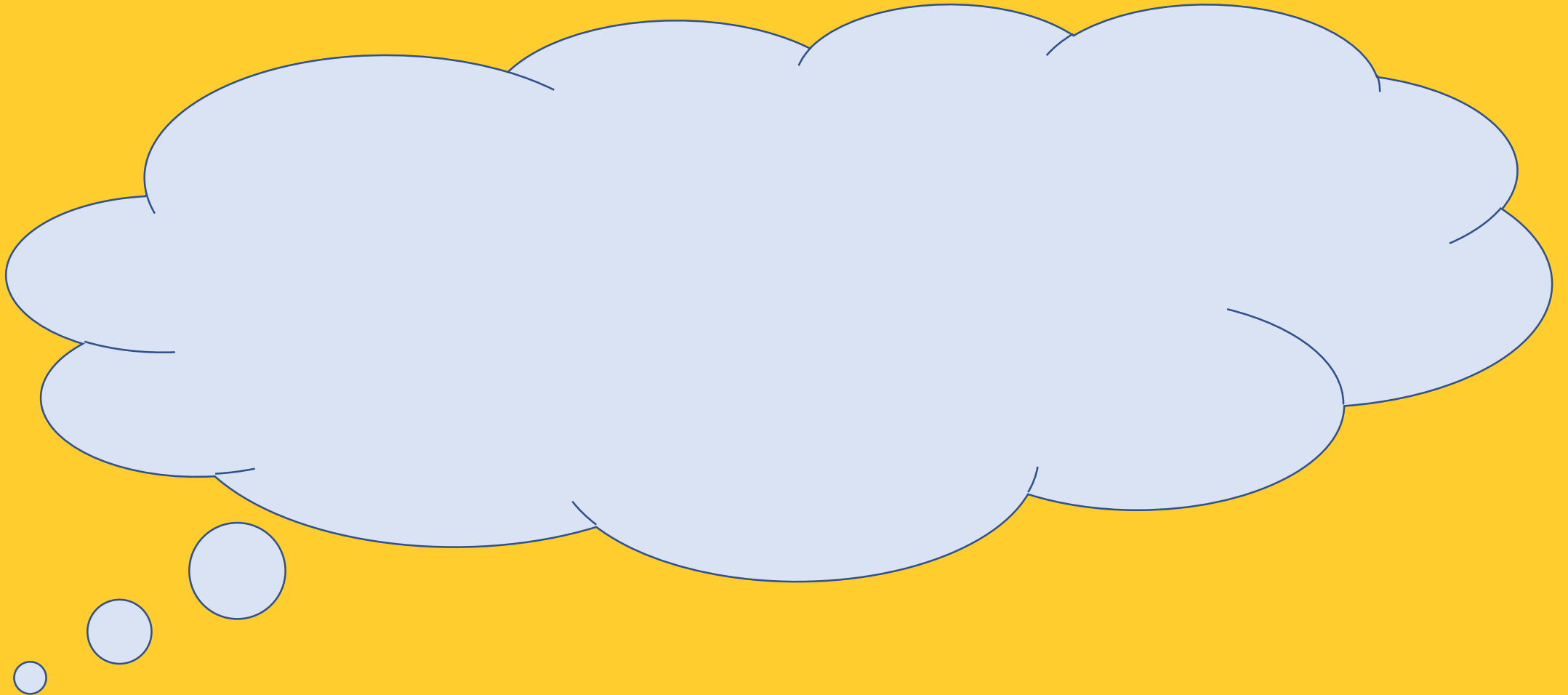
Did you remember
