Look at the information about ahimsa and then use the sheet to write down some different ways the Hindus might try to follow ahimsa in their daily life.  PSHE: Last week we learnt about coping with our feelings. Disappointment is a feeling that we need to know how to cope with. Look at the scenario cards where children might be feeling disappointed. Can you give them some advice about how to deal with their disappointment?	PE: Play the Kings and Emperors game by yourself or with a family member.  Art: Giacomo Balla's style of art is called Futurism. Look at the other examples of futurist art and create your own piece in a similar style.
