LEAKY LAKES

Back on the surface again, and there's just one watery world left to explore. No, you won't need a torch this time. The leaky lakes you'll be looking at are all above ground. Put simply, a lake's a large patch of water that fills a dip in the ground. So all lakes are damp and dippy, but they're also horribly different. Here are some notes Wanda jotted down for you about the main leaky lake types.

NOTES FROM MY TRAVELS by Wanda LEAKY LAKE TYPES

GLACIER LAKES: Fill dips gouged out by ancient glaciers in the last Ice Age. Like the Great Lakes in North America.



RIFT VALLEY LAKES: Long, snakey lakes lying in faults (colossal cracks) in the Earth's crust. Like Lake Tangyanika in East Africa.

CRATER LAKES: Collect in the craters of long-dead volcanoes. Like Crater Lake in the USA.



OX-BOW LAKES: Banana-shaped lakes that form when a meandering river gets cut off.

ARTIFICIAL LAKES: Where a dam's built across a river, stopping the flow. Like Lake Nasser in Egypt.

Most leaky lakes get their water from rivers and rainfall.


In about 40,000 years, Lake Geneva in Switzerland will have been filled by mud dumped in it by the River Rhone.

- I A river dumps its load of mud and sand in the lake
- 2 This builds up at one end, in a fancy fan shape.
- 3 The river dumps more mud and sand...
- 4 ... spreading the fan out further. 5 Slowly, the lake starts to shrink...
- 6 ... until it's completely filled in.
